# Principal's Message...

Reading with your child every night is recommended as it reinforces the skills learnt in the classrooms. Many of our students are great at decoding texts, which means they can identify sounds and words in what they are reading. As a result, parents often concentrate on the reading level of their child. We do not want to push students further along reading levels without a sound level of understanding comprehension.

At home you can assist by working on fluency and expression, retelling the story in their own words and comprehension which is the ability to answer questions about the text.

### Sick students
















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
